Men Of Force Conference—Dr. Harold Davis, pastor at Grace Fellowship Church in Champaign, has for many years run a successful youth mentoring program in the C-U schools called Talks Mentoring (talksmentoring.org). Their mission is to enroll, educate and facilitate instructive interaction between adults and youth in school-based, small group settings. Bottom line—they are trying to help at-risk kids see a way forward to where they can overcome obstacles and reach their full potential.

Beginning mid-June, Talks Mentoring will be working with 17 minority churches in C-U to reach out door-to-door to talk with young minority men and invite them to their July 11 Men of Force conference at Salem Baptist Church. The conference is for young men aged 13-18—they expect between 200-300 to attend. Pastor Davis has asked only that we at LCM pray (especially on July 11) for those knocking on doors that they will be received with welcoming hearts. Please mark your prayer calendars.
