Men Of Force Conference — Dr. Harold Davis, pastor at Grace Fellowship Church in Champaign, has for many years run a successful youth mentoring program in the C-U schools called Talks Mentoring (talksmentoring.org). Their mission is to enroll, educate and facilitate instructive interaction between adults and youth in school-based, small group settings. Bottom line—they are trying to help at-risk kids see a way forward to where they can overcome obstacles and reach their full potential. Beginning mid-June, Talks Mentoring will be working with 17 minority churches in C-U to reach out door-to-door to talk with young minority men and invite them to their July 11 Men of Force conference at Salem Baptist Church. The conference is for young men aged 13-18—they expect between 200-300 to attend. Pastor Davis has asked only that we at LCM pray (especially on July 11) for those knocking on doors that they will be received with welcoming hearts. Please mark your prayer calendars.

Wheelchair Lift For Fellowship Hall – We at the Lutheran Church of Mahomet would like to become completely ADA certified. Insofar as we do not have an interior passage for persons in a wheelchair to access our Fellowship Hall coming from the Narthex, the Building and Grounds Committee would like to solicit the congregation to donate what they can towards a fund to be able to buy an electric wheelchair lift. This lift would be installed on the west side of the Fellowship Hall and will make it much easier for those in wheelchairs to have access. The anticipated cost for the unit is \$6,200. The set-aside dollars that we currently have in our budget is \$1,185...meaning that we will need \$5,015 to complete the project. Thrivent may be able to contribute some of the amount based on what we can raise, so that will help! Starting in June, if you find in your heart to donate towards this worthy cause, please earmark your giving for "Wheelchair Lift" in a separate envelope to put in the collection plate. Together, we can make this happen!
